## WHAT: "Forest to frame" media construction site tours

Owl Creek Landing's Nautilus Lookout Tower, the first of its kind in the USA, is now under construction in Virginia Beach, VA. Guided site tours showcasing its unique and <u>sustainable</u> <u>foundation system</u> are now available for credentialed media during the final building phase.

Get a sneak peek of the project's progress including additional site amenities such as a collection of treehouses that will ultimately be connected by an elevated canopy walkway. An additional opportunity to interview the project's founder, Bahman Azarm of Outdoor Venture Group CEO, also is offered.

Closed-toe shoes are required, and all other safety gear will be provided for visitors.

### WHEN: February weekdays, scheduled on request

With the foundation in place, construction of the 65-foot steel tower and interior spiral slide will be ongoing ahead of the 2025 opening date to be announced. The Canopy Walkway and collection of themed treehouses are nearing completion.

#### WHY: Witness the rise of the nation's first Nautilus Lookout Tower

"This new outdoor adventure concept is the first of its kind in America," says Bahman Azarm, founder and CEO of Outdoor Venture Group. "Anchoring the new Owl Creek Landing attraction in Virginia Beach, the Nautilus Lookout Tower project provides an unmatched opportunity to connect directly with the outdoors at unprecedented levels."

#### **About Owl Creek Landing**

This outdoor haven in Virginia Beach, Va., introduces visitors to native trees and wildlife in a unique and accessible setting anchored by the Nautilus Lookout Tower. Modeled after similar designs in Europe, the ADA compliant tower is the first of its kind in the USA. The 80-foot diameter steel structure allows visitors to easily ascend to the top via a seven-foot wide, circular path or a pair of interior staircases that culminate at an open-air observation deck more at 65 feet high. Immersed in a coastal forest, bird's-eye views from the Tower showcase the area's natural beauty. An optional descent via the nation's longest stainless-steel slide twists through the center of the structure, and a neighborhood of treehouses are

connected to the tower by an elevated walkway for further exploration. A themed light show with Owl Creek Landing's mascot illuminates the forest for a magical nighttime experience.

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
